The liaison between the classroom and his dental practice which he mentored on a part-time basis in the Dental School Intramural Faculty Practice produced a practical approach to understanding the pharmacology of drugs used in the dental office.

Dr. Crossley has co-authored a number of articles and four books dealing with a variety of topics within the field of pharmacology. Other areas of expertise include the pharmacology of street drugs and chemical dependency. He serves on the Maryland State Dental Association's Well-Being Committee. He is an active member of Phi Kappa Phi, Omicron Kappa Upsilon Honorary Dental Society, the American College of Dentists, and International College of Dentists. He was the recipient of the 2008 Gordon Christensen Lecturer Recognition award, presented by the Chicago Dental Society. He has been a consultant for the United States Drug Enforcement Administration and other law enforcement agencies since 1974. Drawing on this unique background, Dr. Crossley has become nationally and internationally recognized as an expert on street drugs and chemical dependency as well as the clinical pharmacology of dental drugs.

# Illinois Dental Professional CE Record-Keeping

Beginning in October 2006, the dental licensure renewal period extended from two years to three. This change affects both dentists and dental hygienists. Continuing education (CE) requirements have been increased by one-third, and dentists will be required to show proof of a minimum of 48 hours of continuing education over the three-year licensing period. Hygienists will be required to show proof of 36 hours of continuing education over the three-year period.

As an Illinois licensed dental professional, it is your responsibility to keep evidence of your CE activities for five (5) years following the license renewal in the event you are audited by the Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation, Division of Professional Regulation. You should maintain your CE records in the same manner in which you keep Internal Revenue Service records.

**CE sponsors are responsible for providing a proof of attendance and shall maintain attendance records for at least five years. The proof of attendance shall contain the following:**

- The name and address of the sponsor;
- The name, address and license number of the participant;
- A brief statement of the subject matter;
- The number of hours attended;
- An indication of whether the program fulfills CE requirements for dentist, dental hygienist or both;
- The date and place of the program; and
- The signature of the sponsor.



CE credit may be earned for completion of an individual study course (correspondence, audio or video course) sponsored by an approved Illinois sponsor. Such courses shall include a test that the licensee must pass to obtain credit. No more than 50% of the required CE credit hours during a prerenewal period may be acquired through correspondence/self study courses.

Also note, courses not acceptable for CE include, but are not limited to, estate planning, financial planning, investments and personal health.

**The Illinois State Dental Society no longer maintains members' individual CE records.** For your convenience, we have prepared a form to log your CE credits on page 7. Store this sheet and your CE records in a file folder in the event of an audit. Feel free to make additional copies of the log sheet.

This course will provide dental assistants with the proper educational requirements as stated in Illinois law for application of pit and fissure sealants and coronal polishing which includes didactic study in anatomy, physiology, pharmacology, and dental emergencies followed by a written exam. This course will also include two hours of clinical experience on pit and fissure sealants and two hours on coronal polishing. The clinical instruction on coronal polishing will include work performed on a human subject.

Each participant must agree to act as a patient for coronal polishing. In addition, each participant must follow the OSHA guidelines for infection control and use of clinical Personal Protective Equipment (i.e., gloves, mask, eyewear and clinic gown).

**At completion of this course and prior to being permitted to perform these expanded functions in Illinois, the dental assistant must meet the following requirements:**

- Dental assistant is 18 years of age and has been working as a dental assistant for at least 1,000 hours.
- The supervising dentist must personally observe the successful placement of six sealants on a patient(s) by the dental assistant.
- Successful participant will receive a certificate of completion.

# Local Anesthesia

## Clinical Certification Course for Dental Auxiliary—Target Audience: Dental Hygienists

April 11, 12, 18 & 19 – UIC College of Dentistry, Chicago

September 19, 20, 26 & 27 – UIC College of Dentistry, Chicago

All courses are 8:30 am to 5:00 pm

This four-day course will satisfy the State of Illinois expanded function training requirements to allow registered dental hygienists to administer local anesthesia under the general supervision of a licensed dentist.

Course content provides a review of necessary knowledge on the uses and potential complications of administering local anesthesia. A pre-course reading assignment from Dr. Stanley F. Malamed's *Handbook of Local Anesthesia* (4<sup>th</sup> or 5<sup>th</sup> edition) assures a foundation of understanding that is reinforced by lectures. Topics include the local anesthesia armamentarium, neuroanatomy and neurophysiology, pharmacology of vasoconstrictors, mandibular and maxillary anatomy, the trigeminal nerve, possible complications, post-treatment instructions, and accurate record keeping.

- Lab practice sessions emphasize grasp and technique and use sensor-active Frasco/Practicon manikins and other injection placement exercises.
- Injection instruction occurs in clinic and involves supervised administration of maxillary, mandibular and block injections using xylocaine 2%, mepivacaine 3%, and topical benzocaine.
- In clinic, participants must agree to receive, as well as administer, injections in the clinic. Hygienists who are in the first trimester of pregnancy or at medical risk for any other reason should seek the consent of their primary physician before registering.
- Course size is limited to 24 persons per session. While a test of basic knowledge based on pre-course reading is given on the first course day, successful course completion is based solely on competency demonstrated in the clinic.

**12 Hour Course**

This course is offered as a continuing education experience for dental assistants who work in dental or oral surgery offices in the State of Illinois where sedation or general anesthesia is administered. The course is designed to meet the requirements of the Illinois Dental Practice Act and the Rules Administering the Dental Practice Act. This course includes both lecture and clinical exposure which is completed at one of the two dental schools in Illinois. A certificate of completion will be issued upon course completion.

**Prerequisite: Current CPR/BLS certificate.**

## **Course Objectives and Competencies:**

- The assistant will become familiar with the anatomy and physiology involved with monitoring and airway maintenance in the sedated dental patient.
- The assistant will obtain a basic understanding of the physiology of the respiratory, cardiovascular and neurological systems as they relate to anesthesia and sedation.
- The assistant will become familiar with the health questionnaire and its application for the evaluation of the patient undergoing anesthesia/sedation and be able to link this information to the ASA classification.
- The assistant will develop an understanding of the levels of sedation/anesthesia and be able to recognize these levels in the patient under dental sedation.
- The assistant will acquire the skills required for monitoring the sedated patient, including monitoring of blood pressure, pulse, respirations temperature and level of consciousness.
- The assistant will learn to operate automated monitoring devices including the EKG and pulse-oximeter.
- The assistant will learn to complete the anesthesia record and make appropriate monitoring entries during the procedure and during recovery.
- The assistant will learn basic management protocols for anesthesia related emergencies and become more competent in assisting the dentist in their management.

This course for monitoring and administration of nitrous oxide by the allied dental personnel will be designed to meet the certification requirements of the state of Illinois for expanded functions. This course will include both didactic and clinical components in the monitoring and administration of nitrous oxide and advanced airway management. It will provide instruction in anatomy, physiology, pharmacology, and dental emergencies, as they relate to the use of Nitrous Oxide in the dental office. This course is open to all qualified dental assistants for monitoring and dental hygienists for administering. After successful completion of this course the dental assistant can return to the private office and provide expanded function for the dental team and the monitoring of nitrous oxide, while the dental hygienists will be able to start and stop the flow of gas.



**Prerequisite: Must be currently certified in BLS for healthcare providers or its equivalent. A copy of your current BLS card must accompany registration form.**
