

What age groups can be treated?

All ages will be seen.

If I am under 18, do I need a parent or guardian present?

Yes.

Is there anything which would disqualify me from treatment?

Each patient will undergo a simple medical exam at the start of your IMOM experience. The program is unable to treat patients with specific medically-compromising conditions (e.g., extremely high blood pressure, high glucose, severe disabilities).

How early should I arrive at ILMOM?

The doors will open at 6:00 am. Please keep the following in mind:

1. Patients will not be allowed in the building before 6:00 am. No exceptions will be made.
2. If you decide to stand in line, please dress appropriately.
3. Collapsible chairs, blankets, and sleeping bags will not be allowed into the building. You will be given the opportunity to return them to your vehicle prior to being admitted into the building for treatment if you use the aforementioned items while standing in line.
4. Security and portable toilets will be available.

Do I need insurance?

No. This is a completely free event.

Can someone come with me while I am being treated?

You are welcome to bring a friend or family member with you to IMOM. They can stay with you while you are outside in line but we will require them to go a family/friends waiting area as soon as you enter the building. You will be able to meet them once you are finished at the clinic.

What types of dental treatment will be provided at the event?

The emphasis will be on basic dental care such as fillings, extractions and cleanings. Limited lab work (e.g., treatment partials) will be offered. Dentures/false teeth/plates will NOT be available.

Will you provide dentures at IMOM?

No.

My entire family needs to be seen. Is that possible?

Yes.

Will there be translators?

Translators (Spanish and French) and signers for the hearing impaired will be available.

Is there a limit as to how much treatment I can receive?

Due to a limited amount of supplies, time and volunteers, we are limited to the amount of treatment we can provide. Our first priority will be to treat your critical dental needs. When you enter our clinic, one of our volunteer dentists will meet with you and determine your treatment plan.

What should I bring to ILMOM?

We recommend the following:

1. List of current medications
2. One day supply of medications
3. Baby supplies for a full day (diapers, formula, etc.)
4. It is always good to bring something to help you pass the time such as reading material, knitting, crossword puzzles, etc.
5. It is also important to bring water and snacks with you.

I am in quite a bit of pain, should I wait to be treated at IMOM?

No. If you are experiencing abnormal to severe pain, you should seek immediate treatment.
